


Sharpening Basics from America Association of Woodturners

There was a Raffle this Month and Connis Wilson will bring a bowl in July to start the process




JULY MEETING



Scott Taylor demonstrated making a "coffee scoop"




This is the finished product along with the donut clamps that Scott used to produce the scoop



The donut clamp with Scott showing starting hole



Scott had preturned the scoop to start



showing the "seat" for the ball to be turned. The top is 1" and the largest diameter is about 2" to allow containing the ball.

Note the slot for the handle.



Placing the pre-turned scoop in the donut chuck.



Pre-turned scoop enclosed in donut chuck.



Starting the hollowing process. You can not see it here but Michelle Freeze suggested that putting a blue tape "flag" on the handle as it spins around as a safety



Drilling hole in ball to start the hollowing process. Tape indicates the maximum depth of the drilling.

Almost a final depth. Note tape on tool as a marker to keep from going too deep.




Final product – the question was is it the right size for Black Rifle Coffee that Wayne drinks.

Top with Brazilian Cherry and Hard Maple by Connis Wilson with friction polish






Segmented top by Pat White and a second top by him. He turned a "platter" for them to spin in when they were working. It is shown below on next page.




Pat Whites top set up
