

Scott Taylor shared about various ways to hold items on the lathe. Here he is showing how one might glue a sacrificial piece of wood to the back of something you are turning. Placing a piece of newspaper between the two



This is a photo of all that Scott brought along for the demonstration



Holding using a chuck jaws expanded into the recess on the back of a piece



This is the tip of the tool that Scott uses to create the tenon or recess for the jaws to hold the piece. It is shaped to create the proper dovetail for the jaws of the chuck. It is sharpened using a diamond hone on one side.



Using the friction of the chuck jaws on the back and the live center to turn the material. To prevent the live center from marking the piece one can place a soda bottle cap between the live center and the piece.



Jam chucking a small bowl. Scott wondered if green wood would make a good jam chuck because it will compress better. It was point out that because it was green it could only be used for that one time.

Depending on the size of the bowl he changes out the circle.






Monte shared about the recent Woodcraft event and the funds raised for facilities for kiddos with HIV in India. \$8,000 was donated during the day for the kiddos.


